



A LINKS Birthday Surprise

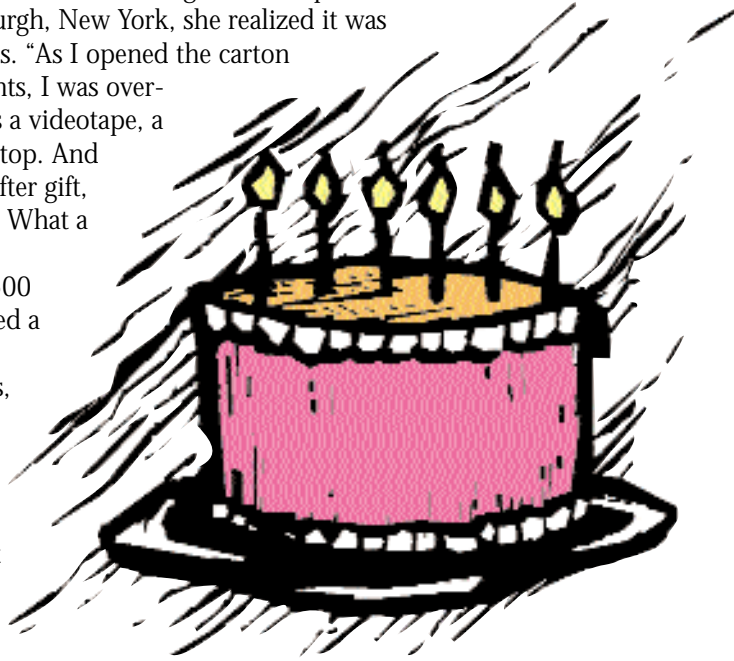
“For...for me?” Gladys Zahner stammered, as the mailcarrier handed her a large parcel. “What in the world could this be!” she wondered.
